

Professor of History, Emeritus, at Princeton University. Often credited with creating the field of study known as Late Antiquity (c. 250-c. 800 CE), he is the author of a dozen books—most recently Poverty and Leadership in the Later Roman Empire (2002) and Through the Eye of a Needle: Wealth, the Fall of Rome, and the Making of Christianity in the West (350-550 AD) (2012). In

2008 he received the distinguished Kluge Prize of the Library of Congress for Achievement in the Study of Humanity.
